Recipes & Pattern

SEMI-RICH FRUIT CAKE

7" cake tin

8oz. (220g) Self-Raising Flour

4oz. (110g) Margarine

4oz. (110g) Caster Sugar

2 Beaten Eggs

8oz. (220g) Dried Mixed Fruit

3-4 tablespoon Milk

1 tsp. Vanilla Essence

Creaming method

Oven 350°F, 170°C or Gas mark 5 for 1 hour 15 mins - 1 hour 30 mins

HEAVY CAKE

6oz. (180g) Plain Flour

1½oz (45g) Castor Sugar

3oz (90g) Currants

3oz (90g) Lard

¼ tsp Salt

Peel (if liked)

CHIPPLE PIE

Shortcrust pastry

Chipples (greens and whites of young shallots or spring onions) chopped

1 cup cooked bacon- diced

Eggs

Season to taste

Line pie dish with pastry, fill (eggs may be beaten or left whole - allow 1 egg per serving) and cover with pastry. Bake in a moderate oven for 30-40 mins.

PREMATURE BABY HAT

Yarn: Baby DK - any acrylic easy wash, but not plain white, please do not use wool yarn. One or more colours may be used. ½oz (15g) is sufficient for this pattern.

Needles: pair of 3.25mm (old size 10).

Pattern: garter st throughout.

Cast on 28sts

*1st row K

2nd row K 20 turn, K to end

3rd row K 22 turn, K to end

4th row K 24 turn, K to end

5th row K 26 turn, K to end

6th row K to end*

Repeat from * to * 9 times (10 repeats in all)

Finish off

Make up: join cast off edge to cast on edge, run yarn through row ends on short side, pull up and secure.

Turn up brim approx. 25mm or 1".

Note: use any suitable techniques e.g. grafting to make a neater hat.

Responsibility

Neither the Camborne Show Society, nor any of its Officers or Servants, shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen from any infectious or contagious disease, or any other cause, or circumstance whatever to Exhibitors or their Servants, or to any animal or article exhibited or property brought onto the Showground; or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of or attributable to, the Camborne Show, or these or any other conditions or regulations described in relation thereto: each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him, including any infectious or contagious disease, and shall indemnify the Camborne Show Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard hereto.

Rules

1. Exhibits may be staged on the evening prior to the show from **6.00-8.30pm** and **7.30-9.00am** on the day of the show.
2. Judging will commence at **9.10am** sharp.
3. Exhibits may not be removed from the tent until after prize giving.
4. Exhibitors are requested to send in their entries at the earliest possible moment. Final date for entries, **Monday 10th July**.
5. The Committee reserves the right to cancel any class and to exclude any exhibit not considered fit for exhibition. The judges' decision will be final.
6. The Committee will not be responsible for any physical accident, no matter how caused.
Exhibitors will not be permitted in the tent during judging, a whistle will sound at **9.00am** when exhibitors or members of the public (other than those who are officials or Judges) must leave the marquee.
7. No exhibit to be handled by the public.
8. The Committee will take every possible care of the exhibits but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.
9. All entries must be entered on the attached official entry form or by email.
10. Exhibitors are asked to collect their entries immediately after Prize giving Saturday 15th July. In the event of any unforeseeable circumstance the Exhibitor is asked to contact the Domestic Secretary at the earliest opportunity. Any exhibit not collected by **5.30pm** will be placed for collection outside the marquee.
11. Prize money will be available for collection from the Section Treasurer after Prize Giving.
12. All prize monies not claimed on show day will be put to show funds.
13. Special prizes, cups and trophies will be presented at **4.20pm**.
14. All cups to be returned to the Domestic Secretary two weeks before the next show.
15. Exhibits in the Handicraft and Photography sections must not have previously been entered in Camborne Show.
16. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
17. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of 2 entries per class, except for the Cookery/Preserves and Junior sections where only 1 entry per class is permitted. *See also notes in Adults with Learning Difficulties section*

Protests

All protests must be delivered to the Domestic Secretary no later than **3pm** on the day of the show. A deposit of £1 will be required with each protest, which sum will be forfeited if, in the opinion of the Section Committee, such protest is considered to have been without foundation. The decision of the Judges in all cases shall be final, subject to the right of the Section Committee to deal with all protests.
