APPLE DICKY

8oz Plain Flour

4oz Lard

2 Apples (peeled and cut)

Good Pinch of Salt

Sift flour and salt, rub in the lard. Add sufficient cold water to make a dry, elastic dough. Roll out flat, pierce all over with the tip of a knife, glaze with milk. Bake for about half an hour.

PREMATURE BABY HAT

Tea-bag Hat

Yarn: Baby DK - any acrylic easy wash, but not plain white, please do not use wool yarn. One or more colours may be used. A little over ½oz (20g) is sufficient yarn for this pattern.

Needles: 3.25mm (old size 10) and 4mm (old size 8)

Pattern: Using thumb method and 3.25mm needles cast on 62sts

Work 20rows in K2, P2 rib.

Change to 4mm needles

Next row, dec 10sts evenly (52sts)

Continue in ss st or a texture st of your choice (not a lace st) for 22 rows

Either cast off and sew up top seam or graft sts

Sew up side seam. Trim hat at the top two corners with small pompoms or similar, or left plain. Fold back brim.

If preferred a set of 4/5 needles may be used, in which case only cast on 60 sts knitting in rounds and dec to 50 sts.

CAT COMFORTER

Any thickness yarn (use 4ply and finer doubled or trebled)

Work a 25cm (10") square either knitted or crochet. Use any close textured stitch. Do not, for example, work a knitted lace stitch or a crocheted granny square.

Recipes & Patterns

SEMI-RICH FRUIT CAKE

7"cake tin

8oz. (220g) Self-Raising Flour

4oz. (110g) Margarine

4oz. (110g) Caster Sugar

2 Beaten Eggs

8oz. (220g) Dried Mixed Fruit

3-4 tablespoon Milk

1 tsp. Vanilla Essence

Creaming method

Oven 350°F, 170°C or Gas mark 5 for 1 hour 15 mins - 1 hour 30 mins

HEAVY CAKE

6oz (180g) Plain Flour

3oz (90g) Lard

1½oz (45g) Castor Sugar

3oz (90g) Currants

¼ tsp Salt

Peel (if liked)

Rules

1. Exhibits may be staged on the evening prior to the show from **6.00-8.15pm** and **7.30-9.00am** on the day of the show.
2. Judging will commence at **9.10am** sharp.
3. Exhibits may not be removed from the tent until after prize giving. See rule 13 below
4. Exhibitors are requested to send in their entries at the earliest possible moment. Final date for entries, **Monday 11th July**.
5. The Committee reserves the right to cancel any class and to exclude any exhibit not considered fit for exhibition. The judges' decision will be final.
6. The Committee will not be responsible for any physical accident, no matter how caused.
Exhibitors will not be permitted in the tent during judging, a whistle will sound at **9.00am** when exhibitors or members of the public (other than those who are officials or Judges) must leave the marquee.
7. No exhibit to be handled by the public.
8. The Committee will take every possible care of the exhibits but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.
9. All entries must be entered on the attached official entry form or by email.
10. Exhibitors are asked to collect their entries immediately after Prize giving Saturday 16th July. In the event of any unforeseeable circumstance the Exhibitor is asked to contact the Domestic Secretary at the earliest opportunity. Any exhibit not collected by **5.30pm** will be placed for collection outside the marquee.
11. Prize money will be available for collection from the Section Treasurer after Prize Giving.
12. All prize monies not claimed on show day will be put to show funds.
13. Special prizes, cups and trophies will be presented at **4.20pm**.
14. All cups to be returned to the Domestic Secretary two weeks before the next show.
15. Exhibits in the Handicraft and Photography sections must not have previously been entered in Camborne Show.
16. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
17. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of 2 entries per class, except for the Cookery/Preserves and Junior sections where only 1 entry per class is permitted.

Protests

All protests must be delivered to the Domestic Secretary no later than **3pm** on the day of the show. A deposit of £5 will be required with each protest, which sum will be forfeited if, in the opinion of the Section Committee, such protest is considered to have been without foundation. The decision of the Judges in all cases shall be final, subject to the right of the Section Committee to deal with all protests.
