- Complete the entry form at the end of this pack.
- Fill in the number, category description PLUS the number of entries per category (this varies, so please check at the total number of entries allowed at the top of each section you enter).
- Please state if you are Junior (under 17yrs old) or Adult (over 17yrs old) so that the relevant trophies can be awarded.

To submit your entries you can choose from the below options:-

- Forward to the secretary, at the above address
- Email it to the secretary and pay upon bringing your exhibit.
- Hand your entry form and fees in at the Kehelland Trust shop, 1 Trelowarren Street, Camborne (please bring the correct money).

The show rules can be found at the end of this pack. We invite participants to enter the show ground the evening before on the 17th July between 6.00pm-8.00pm to stage and display entries.

Car Parking All Exhibitors please note: For staging purposes only, a directive from the Showground Director and Health & Safety Officer, state that no vehicle will be allowed onto the Show Field after 8.30am on Show Day, and must exit the Show Field by 9.00am sharp. All Exhibitors must use the front entrance of the marquee. An admission charge may be applied to drivers plus any passengers, for which a ticket system will operate. Any charge will be refunded to all concerned at the gate when leaving the Showground before 9.00am. Friday evening staging no admission charge.

8. Tomatoes, 4 (salad, any variety)
9. Tomatoes, 6 (cherry, any variety)
10. Tomato, 1 (beefsteak, any variety)

Herbs and Greens: Cut fronds/leaves in any vase/glass/bottle

11. Parsley, 6 stems
12. Mint, 6 stems
14. Kale, 6 leaf stems (any variety)
15. Chard, 6 leaf stems (any variety)

Below ground Vegetables

16. Potatoes, 4 (any variety)
17. Carrots, 3 (any variety)
18. Leeks, 3 (any variety)

DAHLIAS: Cut stems, displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 30. Decorative (any size)
- 31. Cactus or Semi-cactus (any size)
- 32. Collarette (any size)
- 33. Vase of 6 (any size/type)

ROSES: Cut stems, displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 34. Rose, 1 bloom
- 35. Rose, 3 blooms

MARIGOLD: Cut stems, displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 36. African Marigold, 3 stems
- 37. French Marigold, 3 stems

If your not sure if your marigold is African or French don't worry, just enter and we will make sure its in the correct category

HYDRANGEA: Cut stems, displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 38. Hydrangea, single stem (any variety)
- 39. Hydrangea, 3 stems (single or mixed variety)

GLADIOLI: Cut stems displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 40. Gladioli, large, 1 spike (any variety)
- 41. Gladioli, butterfly or miniature, 1 spike (any variety)

"MY BEST": Cut stems displayed in any vase/glass/bottle

- 42. My Best Annuals , 6 stems/ blooms

SWEET PEAS: Cut stems displayed in any vase/glass/bowl

74 - Woodland wonders – A design using natural materials to me made FOAM, FREE size allowed 2 ft

C1/4 Festival flowers A Floral arrangement with colours of the rainbow size allowed to fit A3 paper size no bigger

AGED 6 AND UNDER: 1 entry per class

C1 Festival flowers A Floral arrangement with colours of the rainbow size allowed to fit A3 paper size no bigger

C2 Vegetable Creature

C3 Flowers, 6 stems, in any recycled container (bottle, yoghurt pot etc.)

AGED 7 +: 1 entry per class

C4 Festival flowers A Floral arrangement with colours of the rainbow size allowed to fit A3 paper size no bigger

C5 A Vegetable Creature

C6 Flowers, 6 stems in any recycled container (bottle, yoghurt pot etc.)

RULES

Please have fun! We invite everyone to enter, whether you're a seasoned pro or a first timer. Feel free to display your hard work in any containers you have to hand.

1. Exhibits may be staged on the evening prior to the show from 6.00pm-8.00pm
Exhibits must be staged by 9.30am sharp on the day of the show
2. Judging will commence at 9.45am sharp
3. Exhibits must not be removed from the tent until 4pm
4. Exhibitors are reminded that entries will not be accepted after Thursday 16th July
5. The committee reserves the right to cancel any class and to exclude any exhibit not considered fit for exhibition. The judge's decision will be final.
6. The committee will not be responsible for any physical accident, no matter how caused.
7. Exhibitors will not be permitted in the tent during judging. Everyone other than officials and assistants must leave the tent at 9.30am.
8. No exhibits may be handled by the public.
9. The committee will take every possible care of the exhibits but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.
10. Exhibitors are asked to collect their entries immediately after the closing time of the show.
12. Prize money will be available for collection from the secretary after prize giving.
13. Prizes not collected on the day will be put into show funds.
14. Cups and trophies will be presented at 3.30pm.
15. Cups and trophies should be returned to secretary one month before next show.

Protests

All protests must be delivered to the secretary of the show not later than 2pm on the day of the show. A deposit of £1 will be required with each protest, which sum will be forfeited if, in the opinion of the committee, such protest is considered to have been without foundation. The decision of the judges in all cases shall be final, subject to the right of the committee of the show to deal with all protests.
